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






AMAR CHITRA KATHA THE TRUST CAME TO BE KNOWN AS THE SIR PORABJI TATA TRUST. WITH RUPEES ONE CRORE RAISED IN 1932, IT WAS POSSIBLY THE LARGEST ENDOWMENT EVER. 

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## MEHERBAI TATA

"A woman has the power to shape her family's future. She has the power to instil the right values and mould entire generations, building a nation of people free of ignorance, superstition and prejudice."

Lady Meherbai Tata strongly believed that women could do this and more. For that they needed education and a voice and she was determined to provide both.

Tirelessly campaigning for women's education and using her own voice to raise awareness, Meherbai's wisdom and courage made her the international face of the modern Indian woman. Her bird's eye view of society led her to challenge child marriage in the early 20th century and create avenues for women to study, gain experience and themselves become instruments of change. Generous, practical, kind, and inclusive, her empathy and understanding helped her bridge the gap between the rich and the poor. Women from all sections of society trusted her to advocate for them.

Married into the wealthy and influential Tata family, she used her resources to instil a sense of value and self-worth in women. She, successfully, carved a path that helped Indian women discover themselves and establish their identity and place in society.
